

CAMPBELL ISD DRUG TESTING POLICY
2006-2007

A student who participates in UIL Athletic and Academic Activities and Extracurricular Programs are subject to a student drug-testing program. Campbell ISD's drug testing policy was implemented in 2005-2006. Once a student or a parent/guardian of a student enters the drug policy, the consequences of the policy will apply to the student. This drug testing policy is a mandatory policy for involvement in UIL activities and all other extracurricular activities.

The United States Supreme Court has ruled that drug testing is legal for students participating in UIL Athletic and Academic activities and extracurricular programs. The court noted that the effects of drugs could contribute to a greater risk of injury and those who use drugs are often leaders in the student culture. This confirms the opinion of the Campbell Independent School District Board of Trustees that for the safety and well being of all students, it is the district's obligation to ensure, to the extent possible, that participants in UIL Athletic and Academic activities and extracurricular programs are drug and/or alcohol free.

During the month of August or September Campbell ISD will conduct the initial drug testing of all students in grades 7-12 that will be participating in UIL Athletic and Academic activities as well as extracurricular programs.

1. Testing will be done in accordance with accepted practices and procedures and established by the drug-testing laboratory affiliated with the district. The test parameters will be set at industry-accepted standards as defined by the National Institute for Drug Abuse (NIDA).
2. The District reserves the right to test for all illegal or addictive drugs.
3. Initial testing will be done each school year during the month of August or September. Thereafter, each test throughout the year will be randomly generated by computer. Student privacy will be protected to the maximum extent possible and provided only to district administrators and personnel responsible for administering this program. Administrators will share the results with parents/guardians.
4. Beginning in 2005-2006 in order for a student to participate in any UIL Athletic/Academic competition or extracurricular program, the parent or a legal guardian must give permission for this testing to be conducted on their child. If a student is of legal age, he or she must sign a permission form in order to participate.
5. The following consequences will be applicable to all UIL Athletics/Academics and extracurricular programs regardless of prior policies. Students desiring to appeal the consequence shall follow the appeal procedures policy FNG (LEGAL) and FNG (LOCAL).

DRUG TESTING 2006-2007
CONSEQUENCES ASSOCIATED

FIRST POSITIVE TEST RESULT:

1. A test will be performed by the school approved drug-testing laboratory to confirm the initial test results. The parent (or the student, if the student is an adult or married) will be notified of the results and may have a second test run on the original sample (at the expense of the student or parent) by the school laboratory at the parent's or student's request;
2. Required parent/guardian meeting;
3. Suspension from all UIL Athletic/Academic activities and extracurricular activities for a period of 30 calendar days (Suspension will begin on the day the results are confirmed);
4. Refer to outside sources for counseling at the parent's request; require school counseling;
5. Retest during next random testing;
6. Suspension will begin the day the results are confirmed.

SECOND POSITIVE TEST RESULT:

1. Suspension from UIL Athletic and Academic Activities and extracurricular programs for the remainder of the school year;
2. Required parent/guardian meeting;
3. Refer to outside sources for counseling at the parent's request;
4. Required school counseling

Each time a student refuses to take a drug test or cannot complete the test, after having signed the permission slip, it will be treated as a positive test. The above consequences will be followed.

Students who would like to volunteer to enter the program may do so, respective of the same consequences stated above. Students who do not declare at the beginning of the school year their intent to participate in UIL Athletic and Academic Activities and extracurricular activities, will be tested at the time of their declaration into the activity.
